What Is Optos Retinal Imaging?

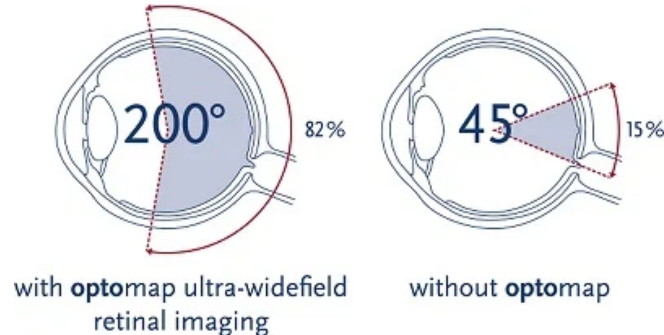
The Optos is a specialized camera that quickly and accurately captures a single, high-definition, ultra-widefield image of your retina. Your retina is a thin layer of tissue that lines the inner surface of the back of your eye.

Why Is Optos Retinal Imaging So Important?

Optos Retinal Imaging enables your Doctor to discover, diagnose, document, and treat sight threatening ocular pathology that may otherwise go undetected. Without Optos Retinal Imaging (or a standard dilated retinal exam), your Doctor is not able to view your retina.

Optos Retinal Imaging will be done instead of dilating your eyes with drops.

Since we require Optos Retinal Imaging for all patients scheduled on a Saturday, we can either reschedule your exam to a regular weekday, or you can be seen at a different practice.
